I was asked to write an “End of the Year Review” for the Camp Gordon Johnston Association newsletter. This was going to be a long drawn out chore, which I was sure not going to enjoy writing. The first things that come to mind was “This ain’t going to be pretty”.

I soon realized our only disappointment was the Governor’s veto for funding, and the loss of one of the founding members of the Museum, Mr. Sidney Winchester, who lost his battle with cancer.

Then the positive events started to come to mind. Our BOD increased by 3 very qualified members, donations are still coming in , our CGJ Days Reunion was a success, we were asked to participate in the “Victory in Florida” event held at SGI State Park, and we found new organizations to partner with. Our Veterans Day Golf Tournament & Silent Auction went off without any problems, the Veterans Day display At Wakulla Springs State Park was well received.

As for funding, we have sent a budget request to Rep. Halsey Beshears & Senator Bill Montford, we received a Historical Marker, with a grant from the Dept. of State, The FCTDC awarded us funding to start our new complex, our half scale Higgins Boat was finished & is on display at the museum, a member of the Military Vehicle Preservation Association is having a Hughes OH-6 Cayuse (Loach) Light Observation/Attack Helicopter rebuilt & will give it to the museum on a long term loan, our visitor numbers were up from last year to a tad over 4,000 visitors & we are still open for business.

Putting on a big event like the Challenge is very expensive & requires a great deal of work from our volunteers. Funding sources that were available in the past are no longer there & some of our lighthouse organizations are having to focus on maintenance issues & renovations. Also, we are all in dire need of volunteers. It is especially difficult for those of us in rural areas to keep enough dedicated volunteers to keep our lighthouses & museums open & do the needed cleaning & maintenance chores –not to mention putting on special events. Please continue to do what you can to support your local lighthouse & encourage your friends & family to do the same. Even volunteering one day a month can be a great help. Without your help & encouragement, we would not be able to keep the lights burning. Thank you for all your support.



Thanks to the generous donations we received this year from dedicated supporters like you, Apalachicola Riverkeeper and our partner coalitions were able to:

- Prevent the threat of coal ash pollution in the Apalachicola River
- Initiate an assessment to identify potential projects to recover the ecological functions of the river & floodplain
- Remove over 15,000 pounds of garbage from the shores & waters of the Apalachicola Bay
- Produce a Sustainable Water Management Plan for the Apalachicola River & Bay
- Protect Apalachicola Bay by lifting the veil of secrecy on a decade-long oil leak in the Gulf of Mexico
- Continue Outreach; Education; River, Floodplain & Bay Monitoring
Led monthly guided paddling trips
Educated the public on the threat sea level rise poses to the coastal communities of the Apalachicola River Basin
Partnered to host informative shorebird walks
Hosted conservation talks with middle & elementary school youth
Sampled side streams & the main river channel for water quality, habitat & geomorphic impacts
Opposed drilling for oil & fracking in FL region of the Gulf of Mexico & Apalachicola watershed
