Call for RFP's for Camp Gordon Johnston Museum Building

Inovia, LLC has prepared the bid package for interested builders to bid on phase one of the project. The building will be located on 1.3 acres of museum property at 1873 US Hwy 98 west, across from Carrabelle Beach. Upon completion of this building the museum will relocate from its current location at the old Carrabelle School. During WWII, practice beach landings and combat training was conducted all along the beach area where the building is to be located. The structure will have 4,000 square feet with the interior arranged to display a large portion of the photographs, artifacts and displays and is intended to be the first phase of a two-phase construction project, which will ultimately have a second building and memorial park. The Franklin County Tourist Development Council, in the form of a grant, is providing funding with matching funds from the Camp Gordon Johnston Association and private donations collected over the past 17 years.
